Assembly

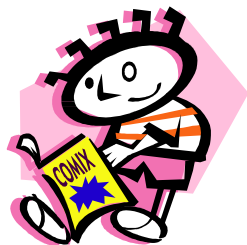
There will be no assembly this week.

Attendance: It's not ok to be away

Are you aware that if a child misses nine days per term from Kindergarten to Year 6 then they have missed one complete school year? By Year 12 this equals two complete years! By avoiding school, students are taking the first steps in isolating themselves from the community in which they live. Being reliable in attendance is a valuable habit for life and builds a connectedness between the students, their teachers and fellow students. Regular attendance is also one of the major factors contributing to a students well-being and successful transition from child to adult. If a student is avoiding school, particularly if parents allow it, then they are putting their future at risk. Whichever way you look at it, school offers opportunities for positive experiences for students. If your child is seeking to not attend school, don't reward their avoidance behavior by giving into them—say NO.
