HEARING AWARENESS WEEK



Hearing impairment, or deafness, is when your hearing is affected by a condition or injury. Some people are born with a hearing loss while others may develop it as they get older.

One in six Australians is hearing impaired, Deaf or has an ear disorder.

Damage to your hearing is often a gradual process - the effects of noise exposure are permanent.

Exposure to noise is a known cause of one third of the cases of hearing loss.

Damage to hearing from noise is cumulative. The louder the sound, the less time you can safely listen to it. Just because a sound isn't annoying doesn't make it safe. Many daily activities won't harm your hearing, but some can start to cause damage after only a short time

Some of the early warning signs are: you can hear but not understand; you find it hard to hear in noisy situations or groups of people; you think people mumble; you need to turn the TV up louder than others or, you don't always hear the doorbell or the phone.
